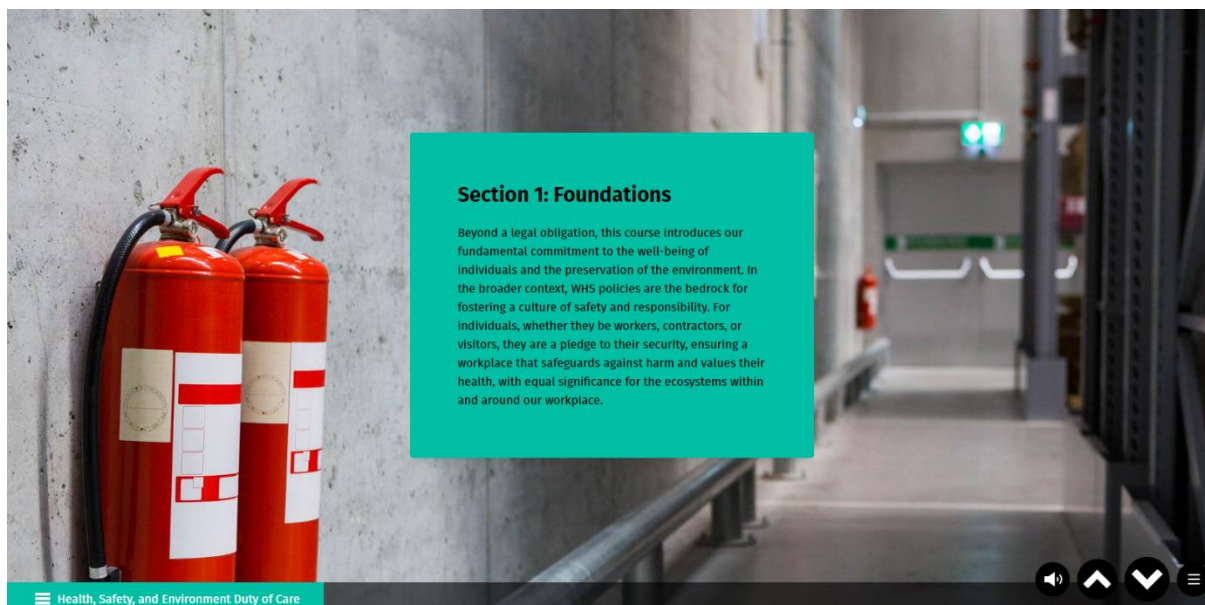


Kando Course Navigation

This guide overviews end-user navigation options in courses developed using Interaction's Kando cloud-based authoring tool.

Kando Course Navigation

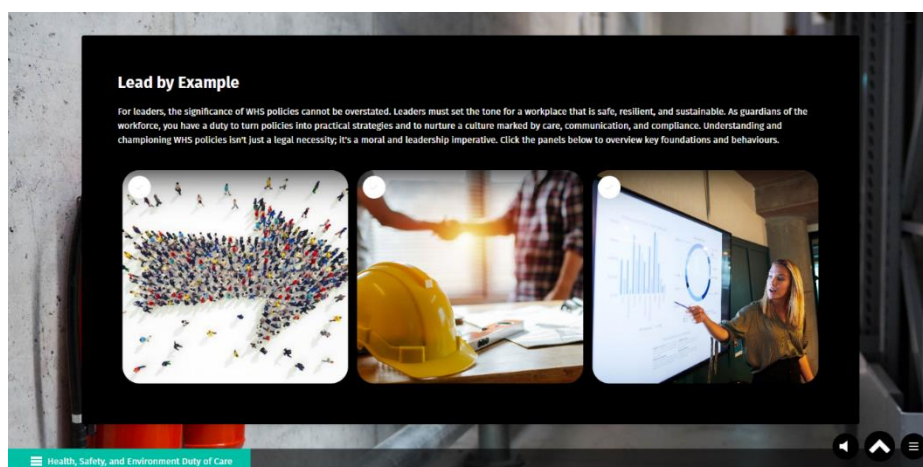
We recommend accessing the course using a tablet or desktop to take advantage of the larger screen sizes on those devices. Courses developed in Interaction's Kando authoring tool are presented through a series of north-south panels you will move through, much like when navigating any modern website.



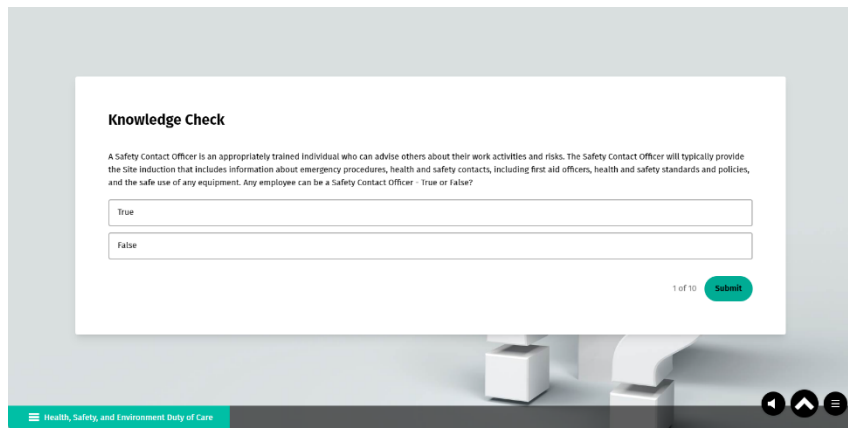
You will find navigation options at any time in the bottom-right corner...

- Kando displays an option to turn the **Audio** off and on. If there is no audio button, there is no audio to play at that time.
- Once you have moved past the first slide in any course, you can expect a **Back** button to be displayed, allowing you to move up to the previous slide if you so desire.
- A **Next** button is displayed if the current learning requires no interaction, as is the case here.

Note: If you cannot see a **Back** or **Next** button, look for instructions on the screen. The **Next** button may not be displayed while animations are being played, or you must complete required actions (such as responding to a question or selecting options presented).



You should expect interactive courses to ask you to answer exercises occasionally, perhaps to reinforce key messages or to confirm understanding. Kando delivers these questions through a familiar interface. Always read the question presented and the options carefully before selecting, as many courses can be expected to require that you achieve a pass mark for your learning to be set as complete.



Accessing the Course Index

Notice that the course name is displayed on every slide in the bottom left-hand corner. Clicking here lists all the topics in the course, with those panels you have already visited available for you to review at any time. In most courses, you must have visited the slide for the options on the index to be available to click on.
